What is a Right?

Rights apply to everyone!

Rights are
 Rules that help
 make people
 equal.



What is a Responsibility?

- Responsibility meansyou respect the rights of others—and expect to have your own rights respected.
- You take responsibility for your actions –
 the way you talk and act makes others treat
 you a certain way.
- You must act in a way that others respect

Rights at Work

As an employee you have certain rights



Right to Fair Treatment

An employer can not treat you differently because you have a disability

Right to not be Harassed

Harassment (teasing or bullying) in your workplace based on a person's disability is against the law

Right to Reasonable Accommodations

You have the right to request reasonable accommodations at your workplace.

"Reasonable Accommodation"

Means – fixing the work place so that you can do your best work.

- Employers need to change the workplace for you if you have a disability so you can work.
- The job may be changed a little.
- The equipment may be changed so you can use it.



Right to Confidential Medical Information

Employers can not discuss your medical information with others, unless they have a need to know the information.

Employment Rights

Right to work in an integrated work setting



Integrated work setting means:



- a workplace where ALL people do the same work,
- In the same place and
- With equal pay.

 You can speak up if you feel your rights are not being respected




