8,487

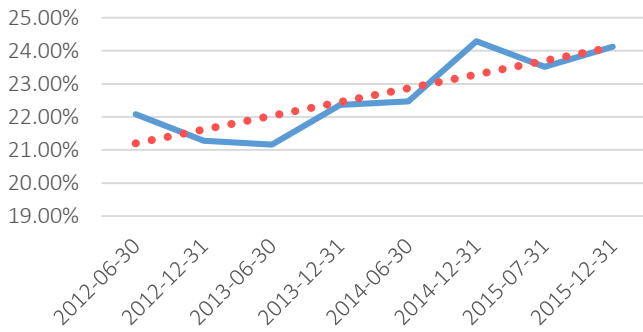
Facility-based employment services:

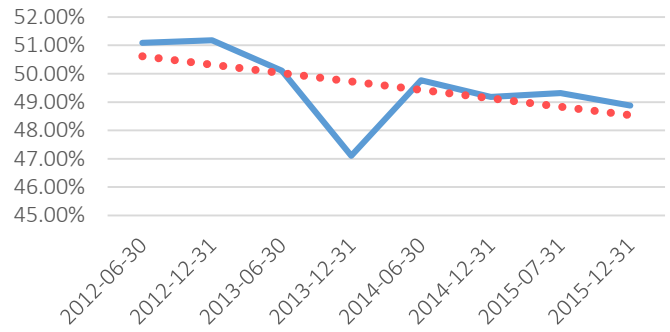
Total in Adult Day Services:

- 41-56% of services

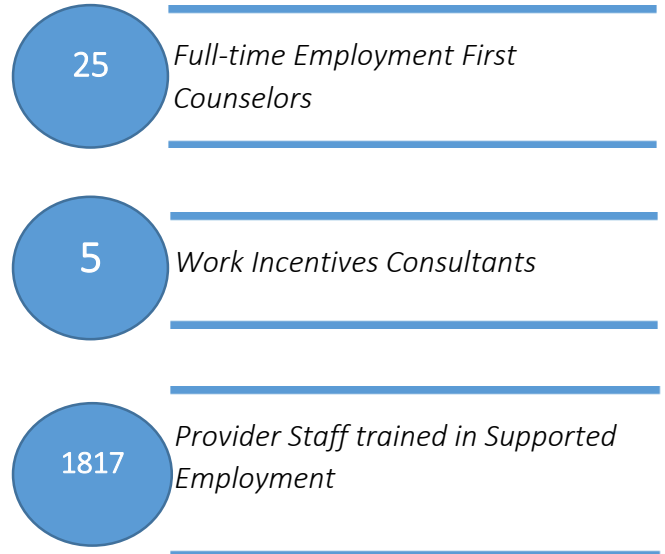

*Please note that this does not include service delivery areas.

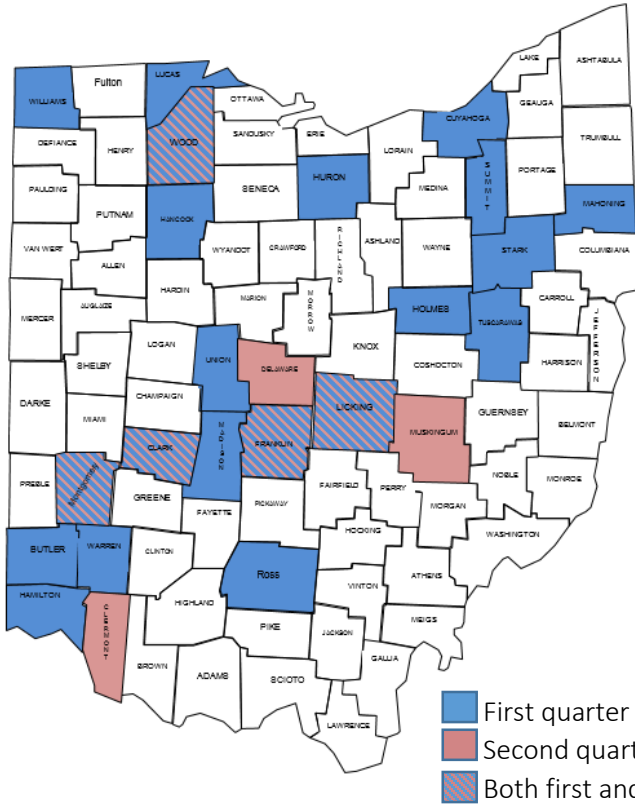
