Moving from a facility-based model to a more community-conscious one takes time, dedication, energy and focus.

This lived experience helps all of us appreciate the necessity of transformation and how it starts and succeeds with attention to how programs are organized and perceived by the DSPs and managers running them, as well as the individuals and families who depend on them.
